The maximum outputs from the sensor (considered as being a source of generated energy) are as follows:

Maximum voltage (between sensing and counter electrodes):

in 0% oxygen 1.25	V
in 20.9% oxygen0	V
Maximum current (in 30% oxygen)0.72	
Maximum power (in 30% oxygen) 1.08	mW

These outputs are within the maximum figures (1.5 V, 100 mA and 25 mW respectively) for simple apparatus as stated in EN 60079-14:2003 Section 3.4.5 c.
